Make Safety the Norm! **OFFICIAL RULES** for RRC Students

Overview

SAFE Work Manitoba invites students from Red River College's Occupational Health and Safety program to tap into their creativity and be a safety superhero! Create projects that promote SAFE work to young Manitobans for a chance to win cash prizes.

Contest Theme

This year's theme is "there's no room for bullying at work". We're looking for projects that focus on themes of:

- Bullying and Harassment in the workplace
- What to do if you encounter bullying or harassment at work
- Workplace violence
- Mental health in the workplace

We want to see SAFE work projects such as:

- Videos (limited to 2 minutes in length)
- Posters
- Theatrical productions*
- Mixed media
- Resource
- Art
- Songs
- Events*
- Campaigns*
- Calendars

** For projects such as events, theatrical productions or campaigns, be sure to include a plan explaining how you will implement.*

We welcome all styles of original student productions including the following forms of video: video clips, animations, claymations, stop-motion videos, music videos, or mashups. Each video submission should be a maximum of two minutes in length. **Videos that exceed two minutes in length will be disqualified.** Please upload videos to YouTube and set to 'public' for ease of sharing.

If you are submitting multiple entries for this contest, each entry will require a separate entry form and a separate YouTube post and/or email with required documentation.

Important dates:

- **Completed projects are due April 5, 2019 by 5 p.m.**
- **Winners notified by May 31, 2019**

Prizes

SAFE Work Manitoba will judge all eligible entries and select the projects that best promote innovation, education and awareness of SAFE work, and also align with the theme.

Eligibility

The SAFE Work Manitoba Norm the Safety contest is open to all students in Manitoba in grades 9 to 12, as well as a separate contest for post-secondary students enrolled in Red River College's Occupational Health & Safety program.

SAFE Work Manitoba employees or employees of other workers compensation boards, provincial and federal ministries, and departments of labour and their immediate family members are eligible to enter and potentially win a prize in SAFE Work Manitoba's contest, but are not eligible to be sent to the national contest. Please note if you are in this category on your entry form.

How the videos will be used

Qualifying entries will be posted on www.safemanitoba.com, where they will be available for download and use by teachers, parents, or employers to educate, train and orient young workers. You must grant SAFE Work Manitoba, the Workers Compensation Board of Manitoba, the other Canadian workers' compensation boards, provincial and federal labour ministries and the Canadian Centre for Occupational Health and Safety (CCOHS) unrestricted use and reproduction rights for any purpose. See section on "Safety Considerations, Legal Information and Disclaimers" for more information on usage and guidelines.

Judging

We are looking for innovative, creative and original submissions. Messages included in projects should target your peers and other young workers. In general, entries should provide a youth's perspective on workplace safety, and in particular, a youth's perspective on the theme, "**there's**

no room for bullying at work". The entries should also promote the importance of open communication about these issues.

Entries will be judged on the impact of their safety message, original creative concept, and technical execution. Projects will be posted online once they are received and reviewed, and judging will begin after the entry deadline.

A panel chosen by SAFE Work Manitoba will judge the entries. The decisions of the judges are final and not open to dispute. Judging will be based on the judging criteria outlined in the Appendices for [projects](#) and [videos](#).

The panel will judge eligible entries as follows:

- 20% creativity
- 30% persuasiveness and impact
- 30% overall presentation of workplace information
- 20% technical quality (technical considerations)

Submission information

All entries must be sent to SAFE Work Manitoba no later than **5 p.m. on Friday, April 5, 2019**. All entries must be submitted via email, and each entry must include an official contest entry form that has been signed by a teacher sponsor. All submissions become the property of SAFE Work Manitoba and the Workers Compensation Board of Manitoba (WCB). If you have more than one project to submit, you may submit each project with a separate email. Winners may have their projects profiled on the SAFE Work Manitoba website and on social media. See the section "Safety Considerations, Legal Information and Disclaimers" for further considerations including consent and copyright. To enter:

1. Complete the [PDF entry form](#).
2. If you've created a video, post your video entry on YouTube, and include a link to your video in the entry form. Email your entry to information@safeworkmanitoba.ca with the [file attached](#). Please ensure that the link to your video or the attachment in your email is valid.
3. If you have created a poster, song, event plan or any other type of resource, please save files in PDF format if the resource is a document and ensure that other file formats are commonly used (i.e., an mp3 file for a song). Email your entry to

information@safeworkmanitoba.ca with the file attached. Please ensure that the link to your video or the attachment in your email is valid.

4. If you cannot email your entry, or cannot upload your video to YouTube, please mail a reliable USB stick with your completed entry to:

5. SAFE Work Manitoba must receive your email or mailed application by **5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 5, 2019** or you will be disqualified from the contest.

Please carefully read all the rules. Get all required signatures and obtain any necessary third party permissions. Attach them to your entry.

If students on a team are from more than one school, determine which school will sponsor the team. Please decide this before you begin your project.

Do not send us physical copies of videos (i.e. do not send us a DVD or a USB stick) unless absolutely necessary.

Example email

Subject: Norm the Safety Contest entry – [Your Name]

- Include a PDF attachment of the entry form (one completed entry form for each student or each student in a group), including the required signatures and permissions.
- If you have created a video, include the hyperlink to your video. You can upload your video to YouTube. Ensure that the URL address you include to access your video is valid. Ensure that the link you include with your entry form is valid and takes us directly to the video.
- If you have created a poster, art project, event, campaign, etc., upload a PDF version of the project (including the plan), a picture of the finished product, or a reliable file (i.e., mp3).

To be a valid entry, your email must include:

- Your project's title;
- Your video URL or PDF or other attachment of your project;
- The team members' names; and
- The school mailing address, telephone number(s) and email addresses.
- Do not submit a physical video attached to your email. (If you cannot send a URL of a video from YouTube, please refer to the "to enter" section of the Submission Information section.)

All entries must meet the criteria outlined in the checklist on the entry form.

These rules may change without notice or reason to comply with any applicable law. By entering this contest, you agree to abide by these rules and acknowledge that SAFE Work Manitoba and

the WCB are not responsible for any damages, costs, demands, claims or losses of any kind, incurred by any student or team members because of participation in the Norm the Safety Contest.

Please attach all permissions, licenses, clearances, releases, waivers of moral rights and approvals with your entry. Everyone under 18 years of age who appears on screen must have a parent or guardian's signature on their consent form; you cannot receive prize money if we don't have a consent form.**

Entries will be void if they are incomplete, late, lost, damaged, or if they cannot be viewed due to a technical error. Your video must be respectful and courteous, and you are responsible for what you submit. To protect your privacy and the privacy of others, do not include personal information like phone numbers, social insurance numbers, banking information, resumes, emails, etc. SAFE Work Manitoba will not tolerate videos that are offensive to an individual or organization, rude in tone or abusive. SAFE Work Manitoba does not discriminate against any views, but we reserve the right to refuse, edit or remove any content we deem inappropriate including any of the following:

- Racist, hateful, sexist, homophobic, slanderous, insulting or life-threatening content
- Serious, unproven, unsupported, or inaccurate accusations against individuals or organizations
- Abusive, aggressive, coarse, explicit, vulgar, violent, obscene or pornographic content

- Content that encourages or suggests illegal activity
